We are so glad to help Jonathan and Paula through this


time in very practical and material ways. But we also hope to bless them spiritually.

Because I can get through the narrow roads in the cities and towns of Guatemala, park in more places and it has great gas mileage. But, when we have teams or schools, then I have to drive everyone in the van. And there aren't very many of our staff that have driver's licenses. That always leads to difficult situations, where I can't believe that I my fat van can squeeze through. Yet I've always managed! A few weeks ago, I had to drive the van on a wooden ferry (my first time ever on one of those!). I was sweating just thinking of riding the small planks onto that thing! Would you risk it?

Was I relieved as I rolled it towards one end. Michael, another of our staff, commented: "That was tight, but not so tight as that one parking lot in Guatemala City! And you managed that one, too!" He was right, that lot took a half hour to wiggle out of. But I also didn't have to worry about sinking the van! Afterwards, I had to admit that I was getting better with each new experience and I am more confident, as well.

Two weeks ago, we had a team of young adults from Michigan at our base. They helped with many odd jobs and in our ministries. They were really friendly and great to





have around. Then I asked them to share the message for our women's group.

"Uhhh... I think we can lead worship and take care of the kids, but share a sermon? I don't think we're ready for that!" Naomi told me.

"Hmm... It's time they did a little sweating!" I thought to myself. After I encouraged them and maybe putting on a little pressure, we agreed that a few would share some experiences of how God worked in their lives and what they learned through it. So Grace and Marisa shared that afternoon and they did a great job!

We all have challenges and problems we have to face. They are often God's tools to make us stronger and help us mature.

We are praying, for all of you and also ourselves, that we become stronger and learn to take bigger steps of faith, trusting that the Holy Spirit helps us bear good fruit for His Kingdom!
