few peaceful and blessed days.

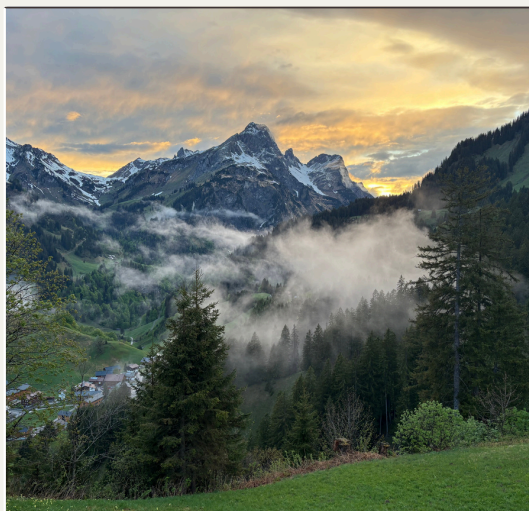
Recently, I had the

I truly enjoyed my time at home with all my heart. It was indescribably beautiful to hug my family again after such a long time apart.

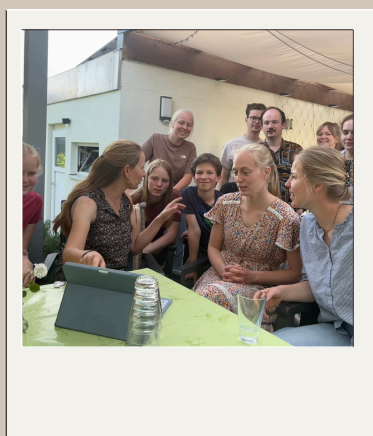
My days in Germany were filled with family celebrations, conversations, laughter, and precious moments together. In our family, there is always something going on.

My prayer is that during this upcoming outreach, people will especially experience how deeply God loves them and how much He cares for them.

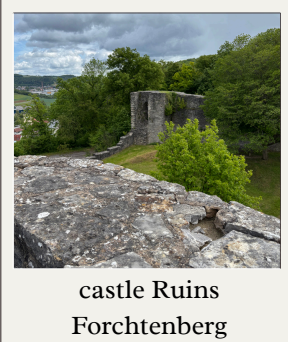
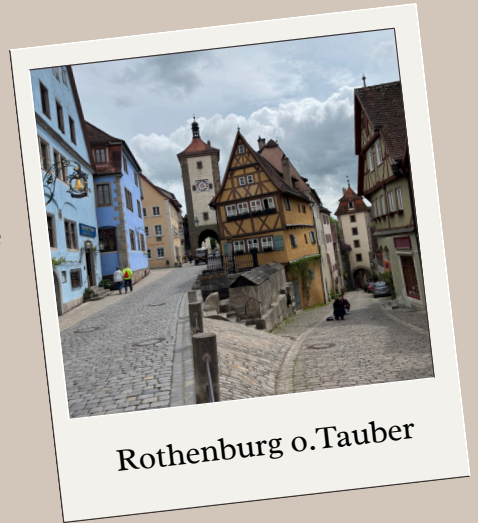
I read following Bibelvers the other day.
