Personally, we are doing **very well**, but Talea in particular is already longing for Germany and we are looking forward to the time we will soon be spending there.

God is providing for us very well here, we have been able to take on more tasks and feel more and more integrated into the school and everyday life of the YMCA. Before the mission trip of the YMCA Munich, which was here from April 2 to April 14, we struggled a bit with the question of how we could better fulfill our spiritual tasks. Therefore, it was very enriching to learn from them and share experiences with them.

Our ministry is currently focused on providing practical education to the children and young people, but should focus even more on leading them spiritually to Jesus and helping them to get to know Him better. This task was a great challenge for us, as we lacked the guidance of a person as well as the knowledge of cultural adapted ways of telling the children about the Gospel. However, the mission group helped us a lot to get to know them and to see how to use them properly. The culture and children here are very lively and particularly enjoy dance and worship. It is impressive to see how much joy they have.

VISITING THE FAMILIES

We **visited families** in the evening and gained an insight into their often **difficult living conditions**. It was also new and good for us to see how the children live with their parents and it was impressive to see how mature and **hungry** people are **for God**.

Unemployment is a big problem and time and again the father is missing because he doesn't feel up to the task of supporting a family or is looking for a job abroad. The mothers are often still very young and the conditions of the families are very poor: families of four live in one or two rooms (even though we were not in the living room of many of them, we could guess at the sparse furnishings).

On the two Saturdays we met **young people** who normally attend the computer courses here. A spontaneously created **Bible study** time, which was **very good** thanks to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, showed the young adults in an accessible way **how easy the Bible can be to understand** and **how God** still **speaks to us** and guides us through it today. At both meetings there was the opportunity to decide for a **life with Jesus**, which was gratefully **accepted** by many of those present. We were very impressed by the openness, the joy of understanding and profound thoughts of the young people. On the **afternoons** we spent valuable **time with them on the beach**, and the first time there was also a small outreach.

Our time with the group was characterized by much joy and laughter, deep encounters, sharing God's love and experiencing the local reality - an experience that had a lasting effect on us and hopefully also on the local people.

Semana Santa EASTER WEEK

Semana Santa brought many tourists from the Venezuelan mainland to the island, which created jobs for a week, but also put a heavy strain on the island's resources. We ourselves had no gas for cooking for about two weeks. Thankfully, we were able to cook with Vanda's electric stove (much to the amusement of our neighbors as we crossed the street every day with pots, pans and food). In case anyone is wondering, the predominantly Catholic population celebrates Easter by attending mass on Good Friday and Resurrection Sunday, while the Protestant community holds a long Easter Vigil on Good Friday and a church service on Sunday.

THE ISLAND IN TRANSITION

We are currently experiencing a **significant price increase**, which is due to **political events** in the USA and the **local currency**, the bolívar (which loses value almost daily). The exchange rate rose from around **61 to 88 VES per US dollar** during our **almost 3 months** on the island.

During our first time surfing, we **met a Venezuelan** who was born on the island but **has been living in Germany for around 10 years**. He and his sister described the last few years as a "**rollercoaster ride**" with a very bad Corona time, but also with **remarkably positive developments in the last 3-5 years**: modern supermarkets, good private hospitals and cashless payment methods have emerged. However, the poorer sections of the population hardly benefit from this. They also spoke of an earlier time of great insecurity on the island.



VISIT TO GERMANY

In a week's time, we'll be on our way to **Germany**. We will be in Munich for a little over a week, which we are really looking forward to.

On Sunday, May 18, 2025, we will attend the service at the GLC and share a few words about our ministry with the congregation. We would be happy to see some of you there;)
