


## IN FEBRUARY, WE HARVESTED 1,285 POUNDS OF KALE!



Despite the hot temps we were able to irrigate our kale using an overhead sprinkler irrigation system. We also grew pumpkins, sweet potatoes, planted baby cabbages, and harvested honey. Our chicks laid 1,053 eggs, and our cows produced 201 gallons of milk!

## MINI DORM UPDATE ~ The boys' mini dorm and bedding are fully funded!



As of March 31st, we still needed \$7,600. **We had no idea what God had planned!**

That morning, we learned of two additional gifts. A pastor from one of our supporting churches also asked what was still needed to fully fund the project: \$7,150. He had prayed and told the Lord they would send half of any surplus in March, to help finish the dorm. Their surplus was over \$15K, so a little less than half covered the \$7,150 needed! **God is amazing!**
